Bodhi Linux Media is an operating system for digital art students, professionals and educators. It is based on Bodhi Linux, a lightweight distro based on Ubuntu which comes with a browser, a Terminal emulator and few more system tools, nothing more. Very lean! The idea is indeed to let the user decide what software should be added and how the desktop interface should look like, a job that Moksha (a fork of Enlightenment) handles very well. Under these premises my contribution was customising the desktop interface, capitalising on the fact that this OS is fast and lean (no random stuff running in the background) and curating a list of opensource software for digital artists involved in many different digital art practices (music, video, graphics, interactive art, coding etc.).
